- **2.** Changes to BY-LAW 8. All fish are to be cleaned, gutted and gilled prior to weigh-in. Only table fish are to be weighed-in. Sharks or Rays are not to be weighed-in. Frozen fish or fish that have been frozen cannot be weighed in.

Members are also reminded that fish presented for weighing must be clean correctly, i.e. gilled and gutted.
